

### Purpose of this dashboard

This dashboard draws together a range of SEND indicators into a concise, graphical report. It compares your LA performance with England and statistical neighbours averages, as well showing trends over time. It can be used to identify relative strengths and weaknesses, plan and commission services, set targets and demonstrate impact. The dashboard covers key datasets relevant to the 3 questions, as in the evaluation schedule in Ofsted's SEN Inspection Handbook, that inspectors answer when making their evaluations<sup>1</sup>:

- A. Identification: How effectively does the local area identify children and young people with SEND?
- B. Assessment & Provision: How effectively does the local area assess and meet the needs of children and young people with SEND?
- C. Outcomes: How effectively does the local area improve outcomes for children and young people with SEND?

The dashboard should therefore be particularly useful in preparation for and during an Ofsted inspection, as well as informing planning throughout the year.

**Updated:** Incidence and primary need of pupils with SEND - January 2023

#### **Important:**

The SEN2 data released in June 2023 is the first SEN2 release based on child-level data, having previously been an aggregate collection. Initial analysis of this data suggests that a small number of LAs have data quality issues that may affect your benchmark comparisons (for example, your statistical neighbour rank), which may get resolved in a future release of data. There are also a number of changes to the indicators currently made available from the collection. For more information, refer to the Notes section.

### How to interpret the analysis

Each indicator on the dashboard has:

- a trend line to show the LA's change over time for up to four years (subject to availability of the data)
- a rank of the LA indicator against its 10 statistical neighbours and the ~151 LAs in England (although in some instances some LA data is suppressed and therefore excluded from the rankings)
- two bar charts showing the difference to the LA's statistical neighbour average and the England average. Note that if the indicator is a percentage the difference is in percentage points; for example, 20% vs 23% is a 3% point difference. If the indicator is a number, the difference is a percentage, for example, 100 vs 110 is a 10% difference
- a 4 year trend showing how the LA performs vs England using the same method as the two bar charts. The latest year of data is on the right.

There are two types of indicator, performance indicators and volume & incidence indicators, as shown below:

#### **Performance indicators**


Performance indicators are those that allow the measurement of "better" or "worse" performance. Note that for some performance indicators better performance means a higher percentage (e.g. achievement of attainment thresholds), while in other cases lower means better (e.g. absence rates).



#### **Volume & incidence indicators**


Volume & incidence indicators have no "better" or "worse" performance, just more or less of something.

The bar is purple where your LA has a larger volume or incidence than the average, and orange when lower



#### **Small number suppression**


In instances where there are fewer than 6 pupils in the indicator, the latest LA value, ranks and differences will be shown in grey text, with no coloured background on the rank.


